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Dear Families,

Welcome to our November newsletter! We are moving into our second half of the term and the children are all working extremely hard. Within this newsletter details of Christmas performances, pantomimes, Christmas celebrations and more will follow. The weather is starting to get very cold, so please remember to bring coats into school for play and lunch times!

Curriculum and Enrichment

Nursery

Nursery have been exploring the season 'autumn' and all the festivals and special occasions that it includes. We had great fun exploring our autumn treasure bags together, we found so many treasures, we had; leaves, pumpkins, conkers, fir cones, acorns, sticks, berries and so much more. Thank you for supporting the children with this activity at home.

We have also explored Diwali and fireworks, this time of year can be so colourful in the sky at night and it has been great to involve the children in recreating their own fireworks that they have seen. We have celebrated the festival 'Diwali'. Diwali is the Hindu festival of light and is also celebrated in other Indian religions, it symbolises the victory of light over darkness.

At nursery we love to explore and develop a love of reading, we encourage the children to read at home with our books at bedtime. At nursery we share a special time daily where we listen to a story read by the nursery grown ups. Our current favourite is 'The leaf thief' by Alice Hemming and Nicola Slater. The silly squirrel thinks the animals are stealing his leaves but the leaves are falling from the trees due to autumn and the wind. Please continue to explore the love of reading at home, it is so important for the children and will help develop their communication, language and extend their vocabulary.

Year R

This term in Year R we are learning about different religions and cultures and their special celebrations such as the Hindu festival of lights - Diwali, and the Christian celebration - Christmas! We will be doing lots of cross-curricular activities to fully immerse ourselves in this learning experience. To start this half term we learnt about Diwali by exploring our Diwali themed home corner, and making decorations in the creative area. We have now changed our role play corner to a Christmas themed one and the children have loved wearing our different Christmas costumes.

In writing we learnt all about the story of Rama and Sita and looked at some photographs of people celebrating Diwali and discussed the beautiful colours, lights and lanterns. We have used our phonic knowledge alongside our understanding of Diwali to write a shopping list to help us prepare for the celebration. We have also looked at the stories "We are going on a Bear Hunt", "Brown Bear Brown Bear" and "10 things not to do with a baby." We have learnt the stories, made story maps and wrote down our own versions.

In maths we have been learning all about the numbers 1 to 10. We know how to make and order these numbers. We have also learnt one more and one less. We have found out which numbers add together to make the totals.

Year 1

In Year 1 we have been learning about the different seasons. In Science we went on a seasonal walk where we explored the changes in the trees and leaves. We then wrote our own Autumn Poem during our writing lessons. We used the stem sentences 'I can see...' 'I can hear...' 'I can feel...'. We learnt about adjectives and generated our own adjectives to describe what we could see. Some children decided to extend their ideas by using conjunctions!

In Maths, we have discovered subtraction. We have been looking at real world problems that use subtraction and solved these using concrete resources. Afterwards, we learnt how to pictorially represent subtraction number sentences. We really have enjoyed the practical nature of this unit! Next, we will be exploring the more abstract concepts of subtraction.

Year 2

In Year 2 we have been learning all about animals and their habitats in Science. We are focusing on the ocean, desert, polar regions and rainforest, thinking about which animals live there and why they are suitable for their habitats. We have been really enjoying finding out lots of fun facts! One of our favourites is that polar bears have a layer of fat to keep them warm in their cold habitat which is called blubber.

Has your stationary ever got fed up with the way you treat them and written you a letter of complaint? In writing, we have been pretending to be different bits of stationary that we have in our classroom, writing to our owners and complaining about the things that they do to us. The glue sticks are furious that we sometimes leave their lids off, the rulers are FED UP of being used as musical instruments and the chairs cannot stand it when we swing on them and they get the blame for our injuries. Whoops!

Year 3

Bones, bones, that's our skeleton! This song is certainly stuck in our brains (inside our craniums) after our science lessons so far this half term. We have loved discovering more about our bodies and so far we have developed knowledge around the name of our bones and muscles.

In writing, we have adopted the role of the devious, sneaky Dr Hunter who is inviting the innocent, unsuspecting animals to his manor for a 'glamorous' stay. We have loved convincing the

animals to attend through our persuasive invitation which has included ambitious and formal language. We are certain that our writing will persuade them to attend!

Year 4

In Year 4 we have been exploring the telekinesis powers of Star Lad in the book 'My brother is a superhero' in our Writing unit. The children have been preparing for their recount by making up their own actions and rhymes as a class to remember the sequence of events.

In science we have been learning about electricity! The children have explored what dangers there are with electricity and how they can identify and prevent any hazards. They are truly experts and have been able to label each room of the home where electricity is used and have been giving tips on how to keep safe. We can't wait to carry on with this unit and set up our own circuits in the upcoming weeks!

Year 5

Year 5 has been exploring our solar system and learning all about the planets, the moon and the sun during our science lessons on space. We are finding everything we can out about space before we have to report back to NASA at the end of the unit to help them on their mission!

In writing, we have been creating a persuasive piece about the problem of plastic pollution in our oceans. We have been shocked to discover how much damage is being caused to our oceans because of plastic, and have become passionate about communicating this through our writing. We have thought about different persuasive techniques we can use to encourage the reader to make a change, and how we want the reader to feel.

Year 6

In Year 6 we have been learning about WW2 and this term we have looked into what it is like for civilians and children of Britain. When the Blitz happened in 1940, children were evacuated to be protected from the bombing. They would live with a foster family in the countryside away from the attacks. We are also currently learning about what it was like for women in WW2 and how it differed from women in WW1.


In writing we have started our new unit of 'Be the Best'. We have been looking at people who inspire us as well as motivational language to write our own piece on why that trait is so important to have and how we can encourage that trait in others. We are going to make sure to include all of our different sentence types as well as our non-negotiables and motivational quotes.


